WIN PLACE & QUINELLA TOTALISATOR

The unit of investment for WIN and PLACE is 50c. Tickets may be purchased in denominations of 50c, \$1, \$2, \$10 and \$50.

The unit of investment for QUINELLA is \$1. Tickets may be purchased in denominations of \$1, \$2, \$10 and \$50.

The unit of investment for QUINELLA FIELD is \$1, and the value of a ticket in dollars is one less than the number of starters at commencement of betting.

Should a late scratching of any runner occur the value of the ticket will remain the same and a refund of \$1 will be given for all winning and losing combinations.

DIVIDEND INDICATION







STEWARDS' REPORT

HAROLD PARK - Friday, 16th February, 1973

INTER-DOMINION PACING CHAMPION-PIONSHIP-First Heat (113 f.)-On the turn into the back straight early in the race. Sahtina (K. Newman) which was racing three-wide, accidently locked wheels with Australis. As a result, Sahtina galloped and lost ground and Arapaho and Kiwi Lad were slightly checked and lost ground. The Stewards questioned I. Lee the driver of Rhodonite on the reason why after completing one lap Arapaho was able to take up a favourable position in front of him. The official film confirmed that Arapaho had gained the position fairly while I. Lee was attempting to regain his trail after the leaders had quickly accelerated away from him. On the final turn, Arapaho (J. Smolenski) moved in slightly under pressure. As a result, Yallara, which was commencing to lose ground was tightened for room. J. Smolenski was reprimanded for failing to exercise more control over his horse. J. Smolenski (Arapaho) was fined \$10 for unorthodox use of the whip in the run home.

INTER-DOMINION TROTTING CHAM-PIONSHIP—First Heat (13 f. & 98 yds.)—Acting on a direction from the Stewards, the Club's Veterinary Surgeon examined Prince Kid before the first race and certified that in his opinion the horse was fit to race. When visiting drivers were presenting their licenses for inspection by the Stewards, it was found that J. T. Slack, the nominated driver for Grand Set was not the holder of a Metropolitan Licence. In the circumstances, permission was given for K. Newman to drive Grand Set. Leaving the back straight on the first occasion, Homage (H. Young) galloped but was quickly brought back to its correct gait. While Homage was galloping, it veered out slightly and D. Dove (Touch Merchant) committed his horse to take an

opening inside Homage. However, when settling back into a trot, Homage veered back in slightly, and H. Young was obliged to check his horse out away from Touch Merchant. This caused Homage to break again. Early in the race, Bambi (J. Smolenski) galloped when it was checked to avoid striking the rear of the sulky of another runner. As a result Bold Command was inconvenienced. The Stewards accepted J. Smolenski's explanation that he was in difficulties in the heavy track conditions.

INTER-DOMINION PACING CHAMPION-SHIP—Second Heat (11\frac{3}{4}\ f.)—Bret Armagh (K. Wills) galloped badly at the start and lost considerable ground. A warning was issued and Bret Armagh will be included in the outside draw from standing starts until its barrier manners improve. In the back straight in the final lap, Davian (C. Pike) galloped when racing inside Burgundy Belle and Welcome Advice. After taking evidence from C. Pike and checking the official film, the Stewards were satisfied that Davian had sufficient racing room and broke without interference. When Davian galloped in the back straight in the final lap, Roscott (1. Lindau) was checked

(L. Lindau) was checked.

INTER-DOMINION PACING CHAMPION-SHIP-Third Heat (113 f.)-At the start, Lord Glen (W. Parnell) galloped and veered out. As a result, Royal Ascot, which was coming from the twelve-yard mark was checked and caused Bill Barry also to be checked. Lord Glen will be included in the outside draw from standing start races until its barrier manners improve. Shortly after straightening up in the home straight in the middle stages, A. Bray (Adios Victor) shifted his horse wider on the track and caused Falcon Scott to be inconvenienced. After taking into consideration the track conditions and other mitigating circumstances, the Stewards fined A. Bray \$20 under Rule 261. The Stewards opened and adjourned an inquiry into the reason why Bill Barry and Princess Light appeared to be checked and caused to gallop at the start. R. Robinson, the driver of Glamour Chief will be called to give evidence concerning the manner in which his horse crossed towards the inside running rail shortly after the start.

INTER-DOMINION PACING CHAMPION-SHIP—Fourth Heat (11\frac{3}{4}\) f.)—On the turn into the back straight in the final lap, Imatoff (K. Innes) broke without interference, and as a result momentarily locked wheels with Just So. A warning was issued in respect of Imatoff. In the back straight in the final lap, when Valencia Bay (K. Robinson) made a forward move, James Eden (F. R. Kersley)

was slightly inconvenienced.

INTER-DOMINION PACING CHAMPION-SHIP—Fifth Heat (11\(^3\)_4 f.)—On the turn out of the home straight after the bell Loaci Ayr (V. W. Frost) struck and dislodged a bellboot. At the start, Yankee Rhythm (T. Warwick) galloped and veered in causing Royal Topaz and Dixie Boy to be severely checked. A warning was issued in respect of Yankee Rhythm. Speedy Ben (K. Murray) galloped in the back straight in the middle stages, broke a section of its hopples, and as a result several horses were checked and Arvillette lost its position and was obliged to race wider on the track for some distance. Speedy Ben failed to Ben. A warning was issued in respect of Speedy Ben.

INTER-DOMINION PACING CHAMPION-SHIP—Sixth Heat (11\frac{3}{4}\ f.)—Durante (R. Sangalli) galloped at the start and lost considerable ground. A warning was issued and at the trainer's request the horse will be included in the outside draw from standing start races until its barrier manners improve. R. Hocking (Reichman) was warned that, although on this occasion his actions had not constituted a breach of Rule 261, he had crossed unnecessarily closely when he took the lead from Titian's Princess on the turn out of the home straight in the middle

stages. On the final turn, when racing four-wide, R. Sangalli (Durante) was obliged to stop urging his horse and straighten it when it commenced to hang in under pressure. A warning was issued in respect of Durante.

INTER-DOMINION TROTTING CHAM-PIONSHIP—Second Heat (13 f. & 98 yds.)—Lucky Sparkle (D. Dunk) broke in running on several occasions. A final warning was issued. Lumpy Dean (O. Glendenning) broke early in the race and as a result Johnny Bright and Odd Adios were checked. A warning was issued in respect of Lumpy Dean.

Scratchings.—Red 15th February, 1973. A Veterinary Certificate that was submitted to support the horse was unfit to compete on 16th February, 1973. The Club's Veterinary Surgeon will inspect Red Vicar over the week-end. Atlantic Star was withdrawn on 14th February, 1973. The connections stated that the horse was unfit to race, and the Stewards are awaiting the submission of a Veterinary Certificate to support the withdrawal.

LATE WITHDRAWALS.

SCALE OF DEDUCTIONS.

If a horse is withdrawn after betting has commenced on the course, the Stewards are empowered to order a refund of the bets on that horse. In addition, if they consider that the late withdrawal would have any material effect on the other win-and-place bets made prior to the announcement of the late withdrawal, they may make an order for deductions in accordance with the following scale:—

Patrons are reminded that these deductions apply only to bets made before the announcement of the late withdrawal. Bets made subsequently are unaffected, except in the case of a further late withdrawal.

In the event of a late withdrawal from a race at a meeting at another course, if an appropriate ruling can be obtained, bets may be paid in accordance with the order of the Stewards in charge of such meeting. If no appropriate ruling is available, the tewards may exercise their powers as described above for local betting.

Totalisator Information.

NO REFUNDS ARE MADE OR DIVIDENDS PAID except upon presentation of a ticket. If the ticket is mutilated or defaced an order for payment by the Stewards may be required.

DO NOT DESTROY your ticket until ALL-CLEAR has been declared.

UNCOLLECTED DIVIDENDS.

Alternatively, dividends may be collected at this course next meeting, up to 9 p.m.

In the event of the Committee declaring all investments off, the money invested will be returned to the investors.

Every investor and holder of a ticket shall be deemed to have made herself or himself acquainted with the Rules and Conditions of the Totalisator which are exhibited on the Totalisator Houses, and to have agreed to be bound thereby.

REFUNDS ON LATE WITHDRAWALS.

WIN-AND-PLACE. If a horse is withdrawn or declared a non-starter, moneys invested on it will be returned.

DOUBLES .- If,

(1) Your horse in the first leg is withdrawnthe moneys will be refunded.

(2) Your horse in the first leg WINS and your horse in the second leg is withdrawn or declared a non-starter after the Totalisator has opened to receive investments on that double, a dividend will be paid depending upon the number of tickets on the first leg.

NOTE.—As a dividend will be paid on the winner of the first leg as set out in (2) NO REFUND will be made where a horse in the second leg is scratched after the Totalisator has opened to receive investments on that double.

QUINELLAS.—Moneys are refunded if either horse is withdrawn, but investments are not refunded if horse withdrawn is bracketed with another starter.

Rules for Investment on the Totalisator are exhibited on Totalisator Houses in all enclosures.

BETTING WITH BOOKMAKERS

INFORMATION FOR PATRONS

Betting with Bookmakers on this course is governed by the Rules of Betting of the New South Wales Trotting Club, and the conduct of betting is governed by the Betting Regulations of the New South Wales Trotting Club.

The following information, which has been extracted from the Betting Rules and Regulations, relates to bets made on the course on the day of the race, and is published to assist patrons. Further or fuller information may be sought from the Betting Supervisors on the course:—

A horse is a starter when it has been called to the barrier by the Starter, provided that it has not been declared a non-starter before All-Clear is declared.

Betting on photo-finishes is prohibited.

Betting one-two (as distinct from Quinella betting) is prohibited.

Bets are void if the race is postponed to another day or is ordered to be re-run on another day.

Dead-heats.—If two or more horses dead-heat for first place, the investor for a win on any horse that has so dead-heated is entitled to be paid the sum of the stakes (i.e., the amount written on the betting ticket) divided by the number of horses dead-heating.

Doubles Betting.—When first-leg horse is withdrawn, the bet is off and the stake returned.

When first-leg horse runs and is beaten, the bet is lost.

When first-leg horse wins and second-leg horse is not a starter, the investor is paid at the first-leg horse's starting price odds declared by the Stewards.

When one horse wins and the other horse deadheats, the investor is entitled to half the sum of the stakes (i.e., half the amount written on the betting ticket).

When both horses dead-heat, the investor is entitled to one-quarter of the sum of the stakes (i.e., one-fourth of the amount written on the betting ticket).

Place Betting.—If there were eight or more horses in the race when the wager was laid, place bets must be paid by the bookmaker on the horses placed first, second and third at the time All-Clear is declared.

If there were five, six or seven horses in the race when the wager was laid, place bets must be paid by the bookmaker on the horses placed first and second at the time All-Clear is declared.

Each-Way Betting.—If there were eight or more horses in the race when the bet was made, place bets must be paid on the first, second and third horses at one-fourth of the odds for the win bet. If there were five, six or seven horses in the race when the bet was made, place bets must be paid on the first and second horses at one-third of the odds for the win bet.

Limited Bets.—In the Paddock enclosure that Harold Park Paceway, a bookmaker, if required by an investor, must lay the odds on offer to an investor's stake of \$40, but is not compellable to lose more than \$600 on any one wager.

The limits in the Leger enclosure at Harold Park Paceway are \$20 and \$300, respectively.

For each-way betting the limits are: Paddock, \$40 each-way and \$800; Leger, \$20 each-way and \$400.


For doubles betting the limits are: Paddock, \$10 and \$800; Leger, \$4 and \$400.

Bookmakers on this course are very strictly controlled by the Club, and are required to conform

to many requirements imposed upon them by several Acts of Parliament and by the Rules and Regulations of this Club. Among other things, they are required to be courteous; to commence betting upon the sounding of a signal five minutes after All-Clear has been notified for the previous race; to display odds for every runner in a race; to settle bets immediately upon the presentation of winning tickets; to write legibly on their betting tickets.

Betting Tickets.—The betting ticket that is given to you by a bookmaker is your documentary evidence of the bet you have made. You are urged to make sure, before leaving the bookmaker, that he has written on the betting ticket sufficient letters to identify the horse on which you have invested and in addition, the sum of the stakes. You are entitled to require a bookmaker to rewrite a ticket which you believe to be illegible or not to represent the bet you claim to have made.

Further, patrons are urged to safeguard their betting tickets, for if they are lost or mislaid it is most difficult for patrons to prove their bets. Naturally, the Club will do everything it can to assist patrons who find themselves in difficulty, but it must be realised that the Club has no obligations in this regard. A satisfactory settlement of these matters is sometimes reached if the investor can remember the bookmaker with whom he bet, the exact details of the wager, and the approximate time when the wager was made. The investor may further assist his claims if he reports to the Betting Supervisor immediately he discovers that he has lost his ticket.
