INFORMATION FOR TOTALISATOR INVESTOR

Patrons may purchase any type of bet and present a winning ticket for payment at any window. Certain windows have PAY ONLY lights above them. When these lights are on, the window will be dedicated to continuous paying on all races.

Patrons may bet in advance on any race yet to be run during the night. The unit of investment is 50 cents for win and place and \$1 for quinella, doubles, trifecta and forecast. Any amount up to \$9,999 may be invested on one ticket. An each way bet can be purchased for one runner per ticket. On all other pools up to six runners can be covered by one ticket.

Banker bets can be taken for quinella, trifecta and forecast. See explanation under Guide to Trifecta Betting.

A guide to TRIFECTA BETTING

Unit of investment is \$1 and there are four types of bet available, SINGLE, BOX, FIELD and BANKER.

SINGLE One combination of three runners to finish in the ORDER AS SELECTED.

Example:—Nos. 4—7—2. Any value of bet up to \$9,999 can be obtained on one ticket.

BOX This will cover the selection of three, four, five or six runners to finish as the FIRST THREE PLACEGETTERS in any order.

FIELD A field bet can be taken in any or all legs of a selection and will cover every runner number.

Example—Nos. 1—2—FIELD covers all runners to run third except 1 and 2. The cost is \$8 for ten starters.

BANKER One runner is selected to WIN and up to five other runners to run second and third.

Example— 1—BANKER 4—7—9. No. 1 must win and if any two out of 4, 7 or 9 run second and third in any order the bet is a winning one. Cost \$6.

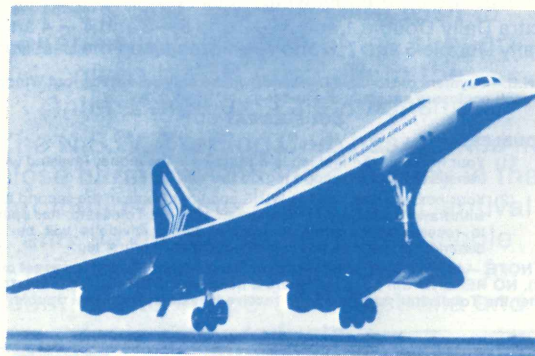
Odds are displayed on television sets and indicator boards in the amount to be returned for \$1 invested. Results are also posted.

Additional detail of meeting coverage, weather and track conditions is also given.

Scratchings are recorded daily at 10.00 a.m. for day meetings and 7.00 p.m. for night meetings. Results and dividends are recorded as they are available.

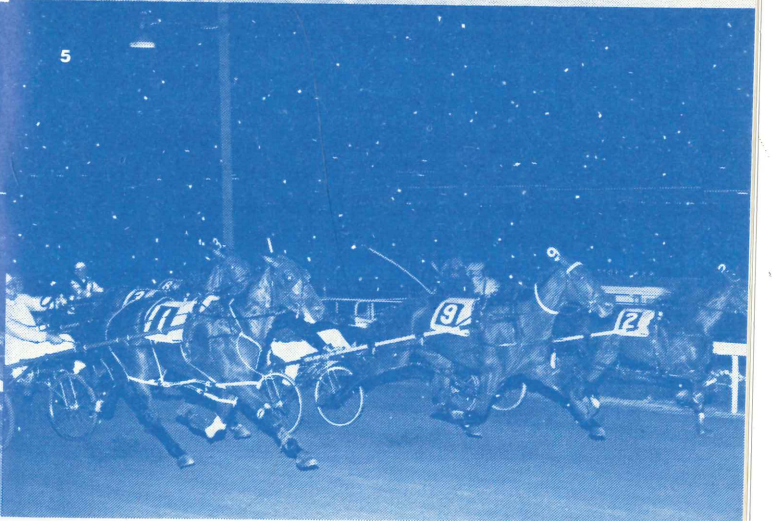
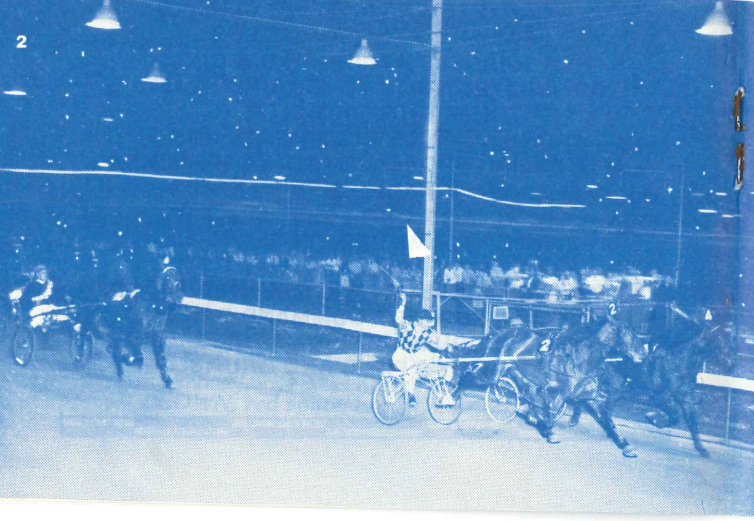
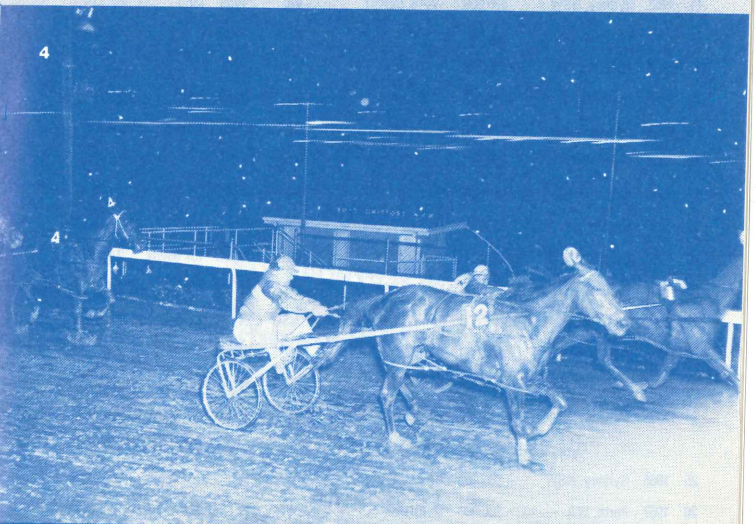
1 1952 was the first year the Inter-Dominion Championships were staged at Harold Park and the Grand Final, worth \$20,000 and witnessed by 38,090 racegoers went to Avian Derby beating Recovered and Floodlight. It was an appropriate victory as Avian Derby traced back to Childe Harold after whom the Paceway was named.

2 1956 honors went to Victoria's Gentleman John who before a crowd of 34,020 finished fast wide out on the track got up in the last stride to beat Mineral Spring in a photo with Caduceus a game third from 36 yards only a length and a quarter away and registering fastest time in the race.

3 1960 was the year of the gallant New Zealander Caduceus. He was making his sixth bid for Inter-Dominion honours and they came his way but not without controversy. Before a world record crowd of 50,346, Caduceus had to survive a protest to hold the race from Apmat whom he had beaten by half a length with Maestro's Melody only a long neck back in third place.

4 1966 and Chamfer's Star became the first "Grand Slam" winner at Harold Park with victories in all heats and the Grand Final in which he beat the great New Zealand mare Robin Dundee and Dale's Gift. The Paceway was a sea of mud but Chamfer's Star, originally a betting discard at 200-1 but 3-1 favourite for the final "outswam" Robin Dundee to win by a long head in front of 24,567 drenched racegoers.

5 1973 saw the "Bathurst Bulldog" Hondo Grattan emulate the feat of Chamfer's Star and go through the Inter-Dominion series undefeated at Harold Park. In the Grand Final, witnessed by 31,070 enthusiasts, one of the closest on record, little Hondo showed his great courage to beat Royal Ascot and Glamour Chief.

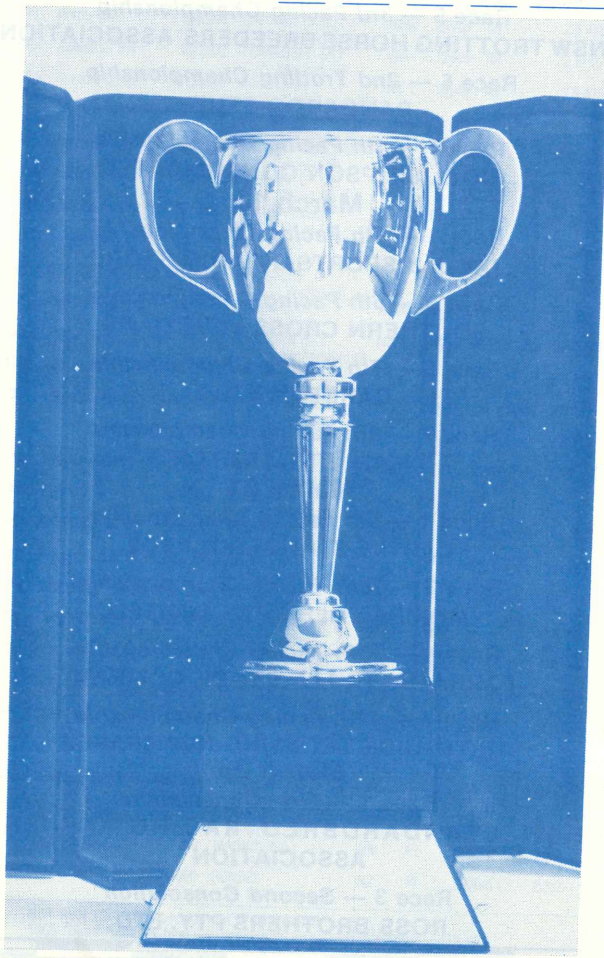

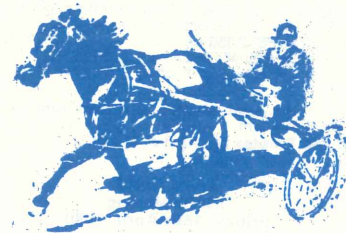

T.A.B. TELEPHONE BETTING

The New South Wales Trotting Club commends the service offered by the New South Wales TAB for its telephone Betting and for Harold Park patrons who at some time may not be able to attend the Paceway, draws their attention to the facilities offered.

Account . . .

A Telephone Betting Account may be operated with a minimum initial deposit of \$5 at any TAB office. Deposits may also be made to an existing Account at any TAB office. Bank Guarantees are accepted in lieu of cash deposits. Winnings are credited to Accounts as soon as is practicable after the event on which the bet was made and further bets may be placed against such winnings.

Withdrawals . . .

A "black light" signature identification card will be issued when an account is opened. By using this card, withdrawals can be made at any TAB office in N.S.W., subject to a daily cash limit of \$1,000.00. Unlimited amounts may be withdrawn by cash or cheque provided prior arrangements are made with the Telephone Betting branch.

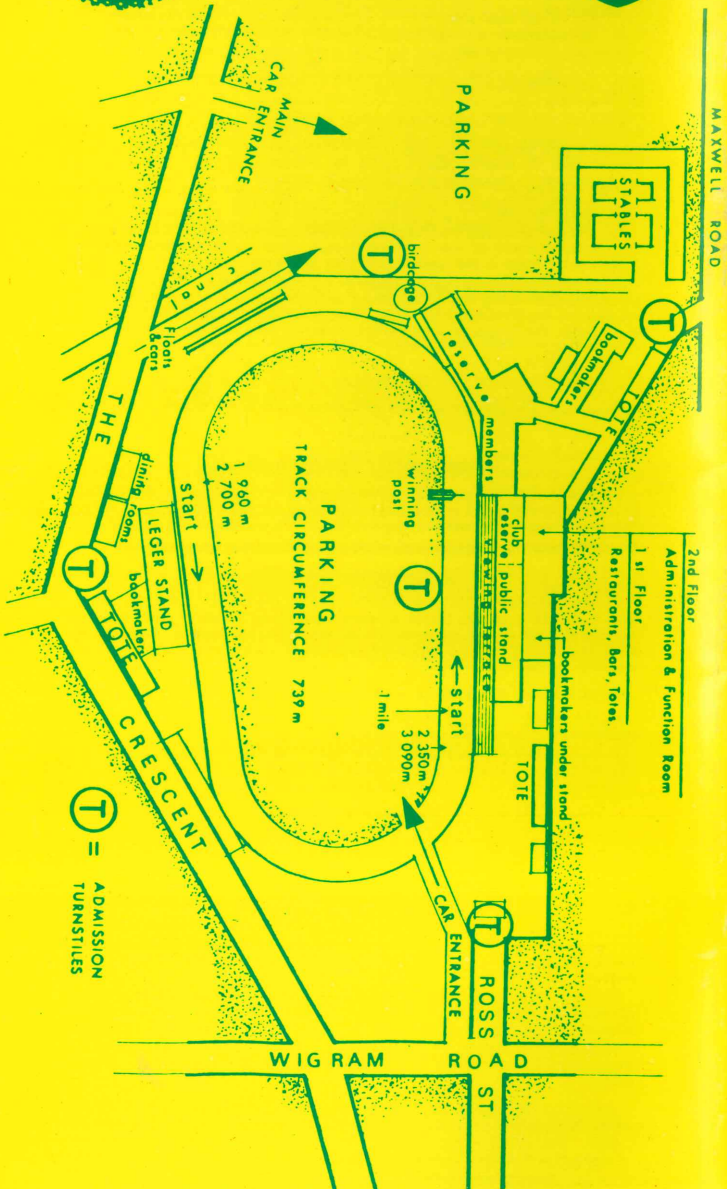
